# A Veteran's Vision - ABOUT WOODY WILLIAMS

HERSHEL "WOODY" WILLIAMS' devotion to veterans and their families began before he entered the Marine Corps. Woody delivered Western Union telegrams informing families of the death of their loved one. He noted that "recognition of the families of those lost in military service was very inadequate."









After Pearl Harbor, Woody enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps and served in Guam, Guadalcanal, and the Battle of Iwo Jima with the 21st Marines, 3rd Marine Division.

Mr. Williams' heroism was recognized on October 5, 1945, when he received the Congressional Medal of Honor from President Truman at the White House.

During the Battle of Iwo Jima, Woody displayed "valiant devotion to duty and service above self" by taking out seven pill boxes using six flame throwers while under enemy fire and clearing a lane for the iconic day the U.S. flag was raised on Mount Suribachi in WWII.

The center void and silhouette of a saluting service member represents the fallen hero who paid the ultimate sacrifice.

Through four granite panel scenes:

<u>Homeland</u> | <u>Family</u> | <u>Patriot</u> | <u>Sacrifice</u>

Each scene is chosen to reflect the individual state and community.
